The excitement continues at Blackwater Mine! We were pleased to announce earlier this quarter our plans increase processing design capacity by 33%. The work for this project, Phase 1A, commenced in September of this year, and we expect it to be complete in in the last quarter of 2026. We continue to optimize the current Phase 1 operation, and we remain on track in progressing the design and engineering for an

optimized Phase 2 expansion. We expect our Board of Directors to make an investment decision about Phase 2 later before the end of the year.

Last month, we were pleased to support National Truth and Reconciliation Day events for the six Indigenous communities we partner with. In our offices and at the mine site, our teams came together in meaningful ways to honour the day with respect, reflection, and solidarity.

Our Community Relations team has been active in the region, supporting a number of organizations and events, including: Fort St. James Men's Shed, Nechako Valley Swim Club, Burns Lake District Fall Fair, Vanderhoof Pumpkin Walk and public skating in Vanderhoof.

## **Blackwater Mine Update**

#### Phase 1A

On September 15th, Artemis Gold announced plans to upgrade the current Blackwater Mine processing plant (Phase 1), increasing nameplate capacity by 33% from 6 million tonnes per year (Mtpa) to 8 Mtpa by Q4 2026 (Phase 1A). The capital cost of the upgrade is estimated at \$100-\$110 million, an industry-low capital intensity of \$50-\$55 per additional annual tonne of processing capacity, funded from operating cash flows.

Phase 1A construction is already underway, with foundation excavation in progress and the concrete batch plant has been commissioned on-site. Major mechanical equipment for Phase 1A has been ordered, including a 3.5 MW vertical grinding mill which provides additional grinding capacity, additional leach tanks, shear reactors, and oxygen plants. Other enhancements include upgraded detoxification systems, upgraded elution circuit, optimized reagents delivery, and a new storage pond for fresh water. In addition, a crushed ore stockpile cover will be added to improve winter operations.

"The Phase 1A plans will deliver a 33% increase in plant capacity, at an industry-leading capital intensity of less than \$55 per annual tonne of throughput. The project will be funded out of operating cash flows, and the payback period is expected to be less than six months. We expect Phase 1A to de-risk and enhance future free cash flows that are aimed at funding a larger Phase 2 expansion. On completion, Phase 2 has the potential to increase production to over 500,000 gold equivalent ounces per year. We are working on delivering the Phase 2 strategy and execution plan and are targeting Board approval before the end of the year."

## Phase 2 Update

The Company also continues to progress the design and engineering for an optimized and accelerated Phase 2 expansion, including alternative methods for mine waste haulage.

Long-lead equipment has been secured to de-risk the Phase 2 schedule, including:

- 18 MW SAG mill
- 18MW Ball mill

A Phase 2 investment decision is expected by Q4 2025


